What does it mean to repent?

There are two Hebrew words that appear as the word, “repent” in our Old Testament. One means **to be sorry**.

Jeremiah 31:19.

The writer here shows that he is not much different from the rest of us; after he got caught, he felt _____ for what he had done wrong.

The other Old Testament word that appears as “repent” means **to turn back or to turn away**.

Ezekiel 14:6.

God did not command to feel sorry, but to _____ away.

The New Testament also has two different words for “repent”.

One means to care afterwards (regret) and the other means to think differently (reconsider).

The first is used in Matthew 27:3

Even _____ repented. He regretted the situation he was in, but he did not get right with God.

All of the verses at the beginning of this lesson use the second word (to think differently). So *gospel* repentance is not just to feel sorry or to regret what we have done, it is to think differently and to turn away from the things we used to do.
